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




District Overview

St. Vrain Valley Schools is the educational home of more than 32,000 of Colorado's students. St. Vrain Valley is the seventh largest school district in the state and operates 57 schools and programs that are spread over 411 square miles serving 13 geographically diverse communities. All traditional schools in St. Vrain are accredited at the two highest levels with some of the most rigorous graduation requirements in Colorado. St. Vrain Valley Schools is preparing students for the future by giving them a strong competitive advantage that will empower their success in a complex, globalized economy. The district offers 70 Instructional Focus Programs including: Energy, STEM, Engineering and Aerospace, Medical and BioScience, International Baccalaureate, and Leadership.

School Overview

Erie High School (EHS) offers rigorous academic programs that prepare students to be college and career ready by providing students with the opportunity to conduct collegiate level work, earn college credits and forge potential career networking opportunities. Erie High School is home to the Engineering and Aerospace Academy and is an Advanced Placement Focus School. Because of the diverse learning opportunities provided to students, Erie High School was chosen by the College Board to host one of the first AP Capstone programs in the state of Colorado. Erie High ranked in the top 20 percent of U.S. News & World Report's 2025 profile of Best Public High Schools in America. Students at Erie High School take achievement to the next level in the classroom, on the performing arts stage, and in the athletic arena.



Student Achievement

- During the 2024-2025 academic year, 716 EHS students took one or more AP classes.
- In the spring of 2025, EHS students took 1184 AP exams. 80% of students scored a 3 or higher.
- The SAT composite score for 2024-25 juniors was 1061.
- In the spring of 2025, 85% of EHS freshmen, 74% of sophomores, and 78% of juniors met college readiness benchmarks on the PSAT Evidence Based Reading and Writing portion of the exam.
- EHS students can earn 65 hours of college credit by participating in these options: 27 College Board Advanced Placement courses, 10 Front Range Community College courses and CU Succeed's college credit program.
- Students have received state and national recognition, including Boettcher Scholars finalists, National Merit Scholar finalists and appointments to the armed services academies.
- Erie High offers 19 athletic programs that compete in 5A divisions, along with thriving performing arts opportunities. Both athletics and the arts, including choral, jazz band, and visual arts, have earned numerous state championships and recognitions.
- EHS is home to the Erie Tiger Network, a nationally recognized student broadcasting program.

Academic Programming and College Credit Options

Advanced Placement (AP): 27 weighted grade courses.
Concurrent Enrollment Options: Front Range Community College, CU Succeed, and Aims Community College.

Innovation Center and the Career Elevation and Technology Center: Internship opportunities and certification programs are offered at these district learning centers.

Engineering and Aerospace Academy: A four-year program with the option for students to pursue either an engineering or aeronautic pathway.
